7. MATTERS WHICH REQUIRE DECISIONS

7.1 PROJECT PROPOSALS FOR THE 2019/2020 DRAFT BUDGET

Pursuant to the Minutes of the Narrogin District Townscape Committee Meeting held on 7 February 2019, Item 8 Status Report Update, the Committee are asked to present at this meeting (28 March 2019) a list of proposed projects for inclusion in the Shire of Narrogin 2019/2020 Draft Budget.

The proposed projects discussed and agreed by consensus of the Committee for inclusion in the 2019/2020 Draft Budget are:

- 1. \$20,000 to plant trees in existing carparks (locations yet to be identified);
- 2. \$20,000 to plant trees into the YMCA carpark on Clayton Road;
- 3. \$15,000 for a design plan for the development of the Mackie Park Mall concept;
- 4. Unspecified sum to pay for an assessment on the condition of the diesel locomotive at the old railway yard with a view to having it restored; and
- 5. Unspecified sum to construct a shelter or other protective barrier over the diesel locomotive dependant on the outcome of the assessment.

7.2 FOOTPATH PROGRAM

The Committee discussed the recently completed footpath program and noted that the paths were finished in grey cement, whereas other footpaths around Narrogin were finished in red.

Plan signage locations and resolve sign styles / materials / installation options etc; 2. Research (including that for QR codes); 3. Theme/narrative development; 4. Writing of content which is descriptive and entertaining; 5. Sourcing relevant images with which to illustrate each panel; 6. Graphic design; 7. Supply of signage with all requisite installation hardware (including posts/pedestals); and Installation of signage. The consultant will be required to make a recommendation to the Shire as to the type of signage and its support structure(s) (i.e. pedestals / posts etc.) to be installed and the rationale for this. It is expected a contractor will be appointed by the end of November and this project should be completed by April/May 2019. 13.12.2018 - Contractor has been appointed and they will undertake a site visit in January 2019, 18.3.2019 - Two panel design options presented to the Committee prior to the 21 March Townscape Meeting.
